Handbags should never be set on the floor, or so says the old Latin superstition. Your money will simply disappear.

Perhaps a more compelling reason to keep your purse up high is the issue of sanitation. Why would you put such an important, often expensive, item on a nasty dirty floor?

Prevent contact with germs, water and dirt with a purse hook. The Clipa is a handy little gadget that hooks onto a table, counter,

stroller, stall wall, or chair. It's simple. Hook it to the table, hook your purse to it. Able to hold up to 45 pounds, it works great for diaper bags when there are no hooks close by.

The manufacturer designed the hook to double as a fashion bracelet. Although weighing in at 2 oz., it will take some getting used to.

The spring loaded bangle also clips securely to your bag when not in use.

The men's hockey tournament reaches its quarterfinals today. NBC has the USA game at 3 p.m.; CNBC has the others at 7:30 p.m., 10 p.m. and midnight.

There's no figure-skating — the women go for gold Thursday — so NBC's prime time can focus elsewhere. That includes the men's 500-meter, short-track competition; it also includes the gold-medal finals for women's bobsled.

There's also a lot of skiing, subject to weather — the women's giant slalom, the gold-medal finals for women's freestyle aerials. Then latenight brings women's speedskating, including the gold-medal finals for the short-track, 3,000-meter relay.

Dogs can tweet too

Mattel taps into social media craze with Puppy Tweets (sort of)

Twitter Inc. has gone to the dogs.

Tapping into the social media craze, toy giant Mattel Inc. is preparing to release Puppy Tweets, a high-tech toy that will allow dogs to publicize their everyday activities on Twitter via a sound and motion sensor.

Attached to a dog's collar, the plastic tag randomly generates one of 500 canned tweets when it detects barking or movement and automatically posts an update to Fido's own Twitter page.

A round of woofing could lead to a tweet of "I bark because I miss you.



There, I said it. Now hurry home." A frenzied run through the backyard might garner "I finally caught that tail I've been chasing, and . . . OOUUUCHH!"

But before you begin to drool over the prospect of having your own Dug, the animated dog from Disney-Pixar's "Up" whose translator collar allowed him to talk, Mattel executives caution that the toy is just a toy.

PUPPY TWEETS \$29.99

» It's expected to hit toy stores and pet shops nationwide in the fall.

Unlike advanced pet gadgets such as GPS tracking collars that keep tabs on roaming cats, the technology behind Puppy Tweets is simply sending out random messages triggered by movement or sound.

So even though Fido's device may be tweeting about tracking a squirrel, he could actually be digging a hole or scratching himself. And that might be a letdown for people hoping for the real thing.
